### The Jane Quimby Book Group

This month's read is **The Left Hand of Darkness**, a science fiction novel by U.S. writer Ursula K. Le Guin, published in 1969. It was among the first books in the genre now known as feminist science fiction. The Left Hand of Darkness has been reprinted more than 30 times, and was voted the Hugo and Nebula Awards for Best Novel by fans and writers, respectively.



OF DARKNESS

The novel follows the story of Genly Ai, a native of Terra, a lone human ambassador who has been sent to Winter, an alien world without sexual prejudice, where the inhabitants can change their gender whenever they choose. His goal is to facilitate Winter's inclusion in a growing intergalactic civilization. But to do so he must bridge the gulf between his own views and those of the strange, intriguing culture he encounters.

Embracing the aspects of psychology, society, and human emotion on an alien world, The Left Hand of Darkness stands as a landmark achievement in the annals of intellectual science fiction. The theme of gender also touched off a feminist debate

when it was first published.

In 1987, Locus Magazine ranked it second among all science fiction novels after Dune and literary critic Harold Bloom stated: "Le Guin, more than Tolkien, has raised fantasy into high literature, for our time".
