

The Jane Quimby Book Group

At the September morning meeting, the members discussed how they really enjoyed Last Hope Island by Lynne Olson. A true account of WWII and all that transpired that one never knew about.

The group decided that they do not need refreshments, just coffee. Whoever is presenting the book is in charge of the meeting and will make and set up the coffee, with help from the other members. Because there is no presenter scheduled for this year's January and May meetings, there will be a general book discussion instead.

The read for the October meeting is A Gentleman in Moscow by Amor Towles. When, in 1922, he is



deemed an unrepentant aristocrat by a Bolshevik tribunal, the Count Rostov is sentenced to house arrest in the Metropol, a grand hotel across the street from the Kremlin. Rostov, an indomitable man of erudition and wit, has never worked a day in his life, and must now live in an attic room while some of the most tumultuous decades in Russian history are unfolding outside the hotel's doors. Unexpectedly, his reduced circumstances provide him a doorway into a much larger world of emotional discovery.

Brimming with humor, a glittering cast of characters, and one beautifully rendered scene after another, this singular novel casts a spell as it relates the count's endeavor to gain a deeper understanding of what it means to be a man of purpose.

While the book is a work of fiction, and a very good one at that, the Hotel Metropol is very real. I Googled "Hotel Metropol" and enjoyed seeing actual places described in the book, especially the Grand Ballroom....Jane F

Two Grand Junction branch members, **Virginia Brown** and **Kathy Singer**, attended the state Fall Leadership Conference in Denver on August 24th and 25th. They were accompanied by two of CMU Affiliate student members, Annessa Bryant and Tatiana Lopez. It was a great way for all of them to meet with other Colorado branch members, share ideas, and learn about the ongoing mission of AAUW. The keynote speaker at luncheon meeting Saturday, August 25th, was **Kim Churches**, the new national CEO as of July 2017. She was a very dynamic speaker and shared with all the visions for AAUW going forward. She talked a lot about the mission of AAUW "to advance gender equity for women and girls through research, education, and advocacy." Everyone realizes this is a lofty goal but one that can be reached by all members working together toward a common goal.

The conference made an impact on all attendees and in the words of one of the CMU Affiliate members, **Annessa Bryant**:

"The AAUW state conference was exhilarating to say the least. We shared time, ice breaking activities, meals, laughs, and tears. Many relationships were established for collegiate groups to meet, tips and tricks for treasurers to excel in their position from local to state level. Throughout the conference there was an underlying enthusiasm for the Grand Junction branch because of our college branch and ability to connect, and recruit individuals who may be different from us.
