## **Talon Winery in Palisade**

(go east on I-70 and take the Palisade exit, Talon is right off the exit)

Saturday. December 11......11:30am – 1:00pm

Talon Winery is actually 3 wineries in one:

- 1. **Talon** which specialized in traditional grape wines (Cabernet Sauvignons, Pinot Grigios)
- 2. **St. Kathryn's Cellars** dies fruit & botanical wine (famous for its peach, strawberry rhubarb, lavender wines)
- 3. **Meadery of the Rockies** specialize in honey fermented wines.

#### There are over 20 wines to taste. Below are the tasting packages:

One 5 oz glass of wine - \$6

Three 1 oz. samples - \$5

Six 1 oz. samples - \$10

Nine 1 oz. samples - \$12

German style mulled wine – one glass - \$6

#### Each attendee needs to pick a package above at the time of RSVP.

Or not, if they just want to hang out with us and not drink. Guests are welcome. Plan to pay Treasurer Virginia for your choice at the meeting.

Also, note that 6 oz. is roughly a glass of wine, so we will not be over imbibing. 🕄
