Dues Renewal Information

Here is NEW, important information for all members to renew your membership:

- 1. Each member will begin receiving monthly reminder renewal information in your email box from National.
- 2. The amount for membership dues will be a total of \$108 this year because of a \$5 increase in National dues. Our Branch, \$26 and State, \$10 dues will remain the same. (\$94 is tax deductible) You will receive information to either pay online OR by check to the branch treasurer, as you prefer.
- 3. For those making payments online: Visit the <u>AAUW Login page</u>. If you have visited the Community Hub before and have already established an account, log into your Personal Snapshot. Scroll down to the bottom and review your Membership End Date. If your membership is expiring soon, click on the RENEW button to renew your national, branch, and state memberships.
- 4. Forgot Your Password or First Time Login: Click on "Forgot Your Password" or "Don't Have An Account". Hint: Enter the email used for this notification as it matches AAUW National records. Connect@aauw.org will send you an email with instructions to complete your profile setup. Hint: It may take a few minutes for the email to arrive. If it doesn't come through within 5-10 minutes, check your Junk and Promotions folders. Follow instructions in your email from AAUW National, clicking to get to the setup page. Enter your email. Click "Create and Confirm your Password". Access your "Personal Snapshot" and click RENEW at the bottom of the screen to renew your national, branch, and state memberships.
- To Pay By Check: <u>Do not send membership checks to National</u>. Instead, mail a check payable to "AAUW Grand Junction Inc" in the amount of \$108 to Carol Airoldi at 2528 Woody Creek Drive, Grand Junction, CO 81505.
- 6. Once dues have been paid, you will not receive more reminders until the next renewal date.
- 7. Members have a three-month grace period following their expiration date to renew.
- 8. All Dual members (those who belong to more than one branch) pay online only!
- 9. Honorary Lifetime Members (50+ years) do not pay dues!
- 10. All renewed memberships will receive a free subscription to Ms. Magazine from AAUW. As of now, we are unsure if this is automatic. Here is a link to order one: <u>free, one-year subscription</u>.

In the process of paying your dues online, you will have a line asking if you want to add a donation. Please consider adding to the **Greatest Need Fund**. If you pay by check, just indicate in a note the amount you are adding for this fund.
