PROGRAM: Participatory Science with Pikas, and Other Interesting Work

Speaker **Johanna Varner**, **PhD** will expand our knowledge about pikas, as well as talk about her other work for which she has won National recognition.

Johanna Varner received a bachelor's degree in biology and a master's degree in biological engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). She then changed gears to

study ecology and evolutionary biology at University of Utah for her doctoral degree. She is an Associate Professor of Biology at Colorado Mesa University. In addition to teaching and conducting research on the ecology and behavior of American pikas (*Ochotona princeps*), she is committed to science communication and to inspiring the next generation of scientists.

Also, **Dr. Varner** was part of the team that recently won the Grand Prize in the #XPRIZERainforest, a 5-year and \$10M competition to develop novel technologies that autonomously and rapidly survey rainforest biodiversity.



Note: If you are unfamiliar, the American pika is found in the mountains of western North America, usually in boulder fields at or above the tree line. They resemble their close relative, the rabbit, but with short, rounded ears.

- Remember. Democracy works on ALL levels of government. Concentrate on state/county/city needs now.
- Join with allied women's groups on issues you care about.

As AOC once said, "Hope is not something that you have. Hope is something that you create, with your actions." Here is what <u>you</u> can do to TAKE ACTION this month:

- Register for **Public Policy Day 2025** to be held on Saturday, February 1. Learn how Colorado is Shining the Light on Violence Against Women. Meet the women who are working to enforce protections at home, at school, and at work. Hear what AAUW's advocacy achieved this year and how you can help in the future. The sign up link is with the flyer in this newsletter.
- An easy way is to sign up for AAUW's **Two-Minute Activist** at https://www.aauw.org/act/two-minute-activist/. Then when a nudge is needed to influence your federal lawmakers, your inbox will receive a suggested note addressed to your legislator(s). An issue summary makes it easy for you to personalize the message if you wish. Push the button and your opinion will be known. The link will show you a list of other actions that may be needed.
- Consult the calendar (which all residents of Grand Junction receive) to find city council or other meetings to attend to make your opinions known.
